### OPENING QUESTIONS

1. What word(s) do you use when addressing Deity?
2. How far can a person get “off track” before they become a “lost cause”?

### QUICK REVIEW

This week we ... looked at the calling of Moses to figure out how we can get our lives back on track.

Looking back at your notes from this week’s sermon, was there anything that particularly caught your attention, challenged or confused you?

### DIGGING DEEPER

Considering that Moses was given up for adoption, raised with Royal privilege, guilty of murder, a fugitive on the run, and living in obscurity ... how cool is it that God calls him to lead the rescue of the Hebrews in Egypt?

Read Exodus 3:1-5.

- Who appeared to Moses from the midst of a burning bush?
- Who spoke to Moses from the midst of the bush?
- Why do you think God uses Moses' name?
- Moses was asked to take off his shoes, why?

Exodus 3:6, "I am the God of your father—the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob." When Moses heard this, he covered his face because he was afraid to look at God.

- Moses grew up in the Royal Household, what did "father" mean to him?
- What prompted Moses to become fearful?

Exodus 3:14, God replied to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM. Say this to the people of Israel: I AM has sent me to you."

- That phrase, "I AM WHO I AM," what does it mean to you?
- Moses was to tell the people of Israel that he was sent to them by "I AM." How would saying this help the situation?

According to Exodus 3:17, what was God's "end play," what did God hope to accomplish through Moses?

## APPLICATION

Do you know someone who needs rescue? Why would you make a good rescuer?

In the story of Moses in Exodus 3 we learn that Moses was reluctant to be used as Israel's rescuer (see Exodus 3:11-12). How does God's response to Moses help you see the potential of your use to rescue somebody?
