## 1. Introduction

**HIV/AIDS:** According to WHO, best estimates show 123,100 adults are living with HIV/AIDS in Cambodia at the end of 2003, 8,000 adults became newly infected with HIV and 17,900 living with HIV were estimated to have died. An estimated 47 percent of adults living with HIV in 2003 were female and 2.2 percent of women attending antenatal clinics were found to be infected with HIV. The HIV epidemic in Cambodia has been attributed primarily to heterosexual contact. While Cambodia still has the highest prevalence of HIV/AIDS in the region, it has been effective in slowing and reversing the spread of HIV which can be attributed to the law on prevention and care concerning HIV and AIDS. Cambodia is also one of the few countries worldwide that has been successful in making antiretroviral treatment available to AIDS patients. In 2003, the overall HIV prevalence among adults was 1.9 percent, which represents a decline from a peak of 3.0 percent in 1997.

Within the context of the National Strategic Plan, Cambodia's Ministry of Health NCHADS introduced a new plan to address HIV/AIDS and sexually transmitted infections for the 2004–2007 periods with the following mandate:

- Maintain national HIV prevalence below 2 percent.
- Lengthen the lives of Cambodians living with HIV/AIDS.
- Ensure that national and provincial programs to fight HIV/AIDS and sexually transmitted infections are evidence-based and managed in a cost-effective manner.

**Trafficking:** Cambodia is a source, destination, and transit country for men, women, and children trafficked for the purposes of sexual exploitation and forced labor to Thailand, China, Taiwan, Hong Kong and Malaysia. Cambodian men are primarily trafficked to Thailand for labor exploitation in the construction and agricultural sectors, particularly the fishing industry. Cambodian children are trafficked to Viet Nam and Thailand to work as street beggars. Women from Viet Nam are trafficked for prostitution and forced labor and also to China and forced to become wives of Chinese men. Foreign marriages are on the increase and make detection and prevention complex as it is difficult for authorities to ascertain whether the marriages are genuine or forced. In recent years, trafficking of women and children from Viet Nam to Cambodia has increased. Between 2000 and 2004 a total of 1,397 known cases of trafficking took place across Viet Nam's south-western border and most of these women were from the Mekong Delta and another 2,917 known cases across the northern border. Between 2000 and 2004, Vietnamese officials reported that 3,667 trafficked women returned from China and Cambodia. These estimates are low and Vietnamese authorities state that there are over 6,000 cases of migrating or missing people that are suspected of being trafficked.

The available documents reveal that about 89% in the Cambodian Project area know about human trafficking but, unlike HIV/AIDS, they believe there is no incidence of trafficking in the local area. It is believed that people in the reproductive age group are most affected and that young girls under the age of 15 years are most vulnerable.

**Gender:** Men are perceived to have more value in Cambodian society than women. Like most developing countries, women are mainly involved with household work and even though, husband and

wife seemingly consult each other in household decision making - men have the last word. It is certainly desirable that all families should have at least one male child. In most cases, girls get married by the age of 17 to 18 years. Poverty continues to drive women and girls to leave their communities and go to urban Centre's and even outside the country in search of economic opportunities. Endeavour will be to give priority to women's participation in the Project through creation of employment opportunities.

### 1.1. Program Information

The Royal Government of Cambodia (RGC) through the Ministry of Public Works and Transport (MPWT) has received loan from Economic Development Cooperation Fund EDCF Loan No. KHM- 9 for upgrading about 84 Km from Svay Chek Commun, Banteay Meanchey to Samrong City, Oddar Meanchey Province.

The HIV/AIDS, Human Trafficking Awareness and Prevention and Gender Mainstreaming Program were a component designed in order to reduce the risk of HIV/AIDS prevalence and Human Trafficking prevention in the project area. The MPWT awarded the construction contract to **KUMHO E&C Co., Ltd.** Who in turn appointed SBK Research and Development (SBK) as the Service Provider for 28 months for implementing HIV/AIDS prevalence and Human Trafficking prevention Program along NR 56 B. They commenced their activities from 01 February, 2012 and would continue till 20 May, 2014

The program has been developed to provide opportunity to road construction workers and construction company staffs to participate in increasing level of understanding on HIV/AIDS, STIs, Human Trafficking and Gender toward reducing HIV/AIDS prevalence and STIs and preventing human trafficking prevalence in accordance with national strategy.

### 1.2. Program Objective

The main objective of the program is to provide information dissemination on HIV/AIDS, Human Trafficking and Gender through conducting awareness campaign to the supervision consultants, company's administrative staffs and road construction workers.

### 1.3. Areas of Responsibility

According to TOR, the HIV/AIDS, Human Trafficking Awareness and Prevention and Gender Mainstreaming the program will cover 84 Km along the areas of NR 56 B Svay Chek Commune, Banteay Meachey to Samrong City, Oddar Meanchey Province through conducting awareness and education to consultant, road construction workers and construction company staffs.

## 2. ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENT AGAINST WORK-PLAN MAY, 2012

This report covers the period from 01 to 31 May 2012 of SBK activities on HIV/AIDS and human trafficking awareness raising and education and gender mainstreaming to road construction workers in Samrong village, Samrong Commune, Samrong District, Odor Meanchey Province and surrounding community members. The education activities were conducted on 04 and 21 May 2012 for road construction worker, supervisor and office staff.

### 2.2. Education Topics

- Mode of transmission of HIV/AIDS
- Mode of not transmission of HIV/AIDS
- Prevention measures
- Suspected signs of HIV
- STDs
- Condom use demonstration
- Migration and human trafficking in relation to HIV/AIDS
- Drug use and HIV/AIDS



### 2.3. Process

The education activities were conducted for both the construction workers and office staffs in three sessions, i.e one session on 04 May 2012 and two sessions on 21 May 2012. The focus of the education was stressed on advantages and disadvantages of blood testing for HIV/AIDS and the discrimination due to HIV/AIDS among construction workers.

The educators began the sessions by asking construction workers and office staff to raise their hands if they have heard about HIV/AIDS before. The educator then asked participants to voluntarily describe the mode of HIV/AIDS transmission and the preventive measures. After that the





educator provided the summary about HIV/AIDS regarding situation, mode of transmission, preventive measures and proper condom use. The educator then ask the participants to discuss the advantages and disadvantages of blood testing for HIV/AIDS, and the pros and cons for dismissing any construction workers due to HIV/AIDS infected. The educator then asked the participants to discuss about the relationship between human trafficking and HIV/AIDS and the role of community members in preventing the human trafficking and HIV/AIDS. Quiz shows were conducted finally to award prizes to participants.



Throughout the sessions, IEC materials were used for visual aid. Before ending the session, IEC materials (leaflet and poster) and Number One condom were distributed to the workers and office staffs. HIV/AIDS posters were posted in the target locations.



## 2.4. Activities and Results

### Construction Workers

On 04 May 2012, one education session was conducted among construction workers and office staffs. A total of **30** participants attended these education sessions. On 21 May 2012, other one education was conducted among construction workers and office staffs also. A total of **27** participants attended these education sessions. The session was conducted in Samrong and Kamnorb Villages, Samrong and Ponsayrak Communes, Samrong District, Odor Meanchey Province. The participants were educated using the above mentioned topics and above mentioned process and methodology.



During the session, group discussions were actively participated by the participants and well facilitated by the educator, particularly on the advantages and disadvantages of the blood testing and discrimination. After the general questions and answers, volunteer participants were asked to participate in the Quiz Show to win the award (soap and condoms). A total of 5 participants voluntarily attended the Questions and Answer.



The discussion on advantages and disadvantages of

blood testing for HIV/AIDS aims to educate about the importance of construction workers and villagers to stay healthy and get proper health care if they are tested with HIV positive.

At the end of the session, IEC materials were distributed (15 HIV/AIDS posters, 200 leaflets and 200 boxes of condom) to these groups.
